Departmental Reports:

Department reports for the month of October 2017 were presented by Mike Hart for Joe Hart, Eden Fire Chief; Matt Blasz for Scott Hunter, East Eden Fire Chief; Michael Felschow, Eden Police Chief; Ray Zabron, Dog Control Officer; Ronald Maggs, Superintendent of Highways; William Trask, Town Attorney; Mary Jo Hultquist, Town Clerk; Supervisor Hartman for Jesse Baker, Zoning Code Enforcement Officer; Amy Porter, Recreation Director; and Robert Pietrocarlo, Chairman Board of Assessors. All reports are on file in the Town Clerk's office.

Robert Pietrocarlo gave an explanation of the Cold War Exemption that was enacted by a Local Law January 14, 2009. This exemption was only a 10-year exemption and is supposed to sunset in 2018, however, Governor Cuomo signed Senate Bill SO56598A (Assembly Bill same as A06510-A). This legislation removes the 10-year limitation for real property tax exemptions for cold war veterans and makes it permanent. In order to continue to grant this exemption, a local law must be adopted.

Attorney Trask stated that a simple local law amending the current local law would be the solution and a public hearing would need to be scheduled in the near future.

Ron Maggs, Highway Superintendent gave the results of the recent bids from the auction and his recommendation:

2. <u>Negative Declaration/SEQR-Violet Parkway Storage Tank – Dome Replacement</u>

Supervisor Hartman read the following resolution:

State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR)

Resolution Classifying Proposed Action Type 2 SEQR Action

Name of Action: Violet Tank Dome Replacement

WHEREAS, the Town of Eden Town Board is considering the replacement of the Violet Parkway water storage tank dome; and

WHEREAS, contract bidding documents describing the proposed improvements are being prepared and will be submitted by GHD for the Town Board's consideration; and

WHEREAS, this project is a Type 2 Action for purposes of SEQRA pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(1) as it involves the maintenance and repair involving no substantial change to the existing Violet Parkway water storage tank, and is, therefore, not subject to review pursuant to SEQRA; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this project has been determined not to have a significant impact on the environment and is not subject to further review under SEQRA.

MOTION was made by Councilperson Pew to approve the resolution as presented; seconded by Councilperson Ventry; All "Ayes"; Opposed? - None; Abstain? - None; Motion carried.

NOTE: Supervisor Hartman stated the dome replacement is due to the damage done during the power washing of the dome.

3. Receive & File New Map & Plan - Waterline Improvement Project

4. Schedule Public Hearing – Creation of Master Improvement Area and Bond Resolution for Waterline Improvement Project

5. Approval of list of owed water bills to be forwarded to Erie County

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to review the Proposed Budget of the Town of Eden for the year 2018.

Supervisor Hartman made the following observations in the 2018 Budget, that was available in the Town Clerk's office for review:

The Garbage Rate for 2018 is \$192.00 per unit from \$177.00 in 2017. Increase of \$15.00, 8.47%.

Supervisor Hartman stated that the Town Board would be over-riding the 2% tax cap, which is actually 1.84% and the main reason is the water projects. Supervisor Hartman stated that the reserves are very depleted and this town board is being pro-active to build those accounts. Supervisor Hartman also stated that the budget meetings are open to the public and the schedule is posted in advance of the meetings.

10. East Eden Fire Truck

Supervisor Hartman stated that after much discussion and having ample time to decide between the 2 tankers, the traditional and the vacuum, it was time to make a decision. Many comments were made by all town board members and all were in agreement as to the time and effort spent by the fire department, with thanks to those present.

MOTION was made by Councilperson Pew to approve the purchase of the vacuum tanker fire truck and to move forward with the bid specifications; seconded by Councilperson Byrnes.

7. Adoption of tax cap override

Supervisor Hartman read the following:

TOWN OF EDEN LOCAL LAW NO. 3-2017

Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Town of Eden to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override

The Town Board of the Town of Eden, County of Erie, is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2018 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 4. Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Resolution No. 1: Negative Declaration Under SEQRA

WHEREAS, the Eden Town Board received an application for a Special Use Permit for an indoor storage facility at the property commonly known as 8800 South Main Street in the Town of Eden; and

WHEREAS, this application was previously referred to the Eden Planning Board and the county Department of Environment and Planning for review and recommendation; and

WHEREAS, an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) was filed and the Eden Town Board previously determined that the proposed project is an unlisted action and declared itself Lead Agency and has conducted a single agency review of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board has taken a "hard look" at all potentially adverse environmental impacts pursuant to SEQR.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board that:

Based upon the Board's thorough and careful review of the Project, including the Environmental Assessment Form and all other materials submitted in connection therewith, the Board hereby determines that the Project will not result in any significant environmental impacts and hereby issues a negative declaration for the Project pursuant to SEQR.

Supervisor Hartman read the following resolution:

Resolution No. 2: Resolution Approving Special Use Permit

WHEREAS, the Town of Eden has received a request from Robert Hornberger (hereinafter "Applicant" or "Permittee") for a special use permit to operate an indoor storage facility at 8800 South Main Street in the Town of Eden, NY; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has received recommendations from the Eden Planning Board and has completed its required referral to Erie County Department of Environment and Planning and has held a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has adopted a negative declaration resolution pursuant to SEQR;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board that a Special Use Permit for the indoor storage facility at 8800 South Main Street in the Town of Eden is hereby approve with the following conditions:

- 1. No outdoor storage shall be permitted.
- 2. The applicant and/or owner of the property must meet the requirements of the Code Enforcement Office for the entire building to be reclassified as storage.
- 3. Site plan review is waived in accordance with Planning Board recommendation as there is no change to the exterior of the building or the site.
- 4. Applicant to install a dial out alarm approved by the Town Fire Inspector.
- 5. Applicant shall allow the Town Code Enforcement Office and Fire Inspector access (upon prior reasonable request) to conduct such inspections as may be required to verify compliance with applicable code and conditions of this permit.
- 6. The Special Use Permit shall be renewable annually.

MOTION was made by Councilperson Ventry to approve the resolution as presented; seconded by Supervisor Hartman; All "Ayes"; Opposed? - None; Abstain? - None; Motion carried.

11. Out of District Water Approvals

Supervisor Hartman explained that under certain circumstances, the Town of Eden may, in it's sole discretion, grant permission to an individual owning property within the Town of Eden, outside the boundaries of an established water district, to access the water main as a so-called "Out-of-District User.

12 homes in the Town of Eden on Route 62 were eligible and 4 of those eligible took advantage of opportunity, being, Kathleen U. Roberts of 9034 S. State Road, Marcia C. Walker, 8919 Gowanda State Road, Marcia C. Walker, 8933 Gowanda State Road and Frank J. Sturm, 9012 Gowanda State Road.

MOTION was made by Supervisor Hartman to approve the 4 property owners listed above, to grant permission to become "Out-of-District Users; seconded by Councilperson Pew; All "Ayes"; Opposed? - None; Abstain? - None; Motion carried.

Supervisor Hartman congratulated Rich Ventry on his re-election and Gary Sam on being elected to the Town Board and thanked Mary Lou Pew for her service on the town board.

Councilperson Pew stated that several residents have voiced their concerns to her regarding the meeting agenda being posted in the Eden Pennysaver. Supervisor Hartman stated that it is a substantial cost savings to post the notice on the town of Eden web-site and that agendas are always available at the Town Clerk's office.
