Supervisor Ventry stated that the current contract with NYPA for maintenance is not being fulfilled as promised and street lights are not getting replaced. The Town is in the process of looking for a new company to contract with but in the meantime the current contract will be extended.

7. Discussion with CPL on Roof Project:

Supervisor Ventry started the discussion with the background on the roof project stating that when the bid process originally started CPL estimated the total cost would be \$400,000. The Town received two bids, one for one million dollars and another for two million dollars, which was extremely more than was originally expected. The Town rejected both bids and is now looking to CPL for explanation.

Brian Kulpa, Town Planner with CPL, lead a discussion with the Town Board on the proposed roof project at Town Hall, stating his firm was at fault and would like to re-bid the project using multiple scenarios. Mr. Kulpa advised the Town Board that he would not be billing for the time involved in the re-bid process as the fault lies on CPL. He will work directly on the bid to ensure that the bid specifications hopefully result in a lower cost to the Town.

Over the next two weeks Mr. Kulpa will work with the Town to prepare the new specifications and expects that the Town can set a bid date at the August Town Board Meeting with hopes to approve a bid at the September Town Board Meeting.

8. Special Use Permit for 9411 Sandrock Road:

- All permitting documents (State Liquor Authority, Erie County Department of Health) must be available on site at all times and produced upon request to the Code Enforcement Officer to ensure compliance
- No more than two food vendors and two alcohol venders per event
- Hours of operation will be 30 minutes after dawn until 30 minutes before dusk
- Maximum of 50 guests (plus workers) per event
